(Re)Engage Alabama (SB175, Act 2023-539) Zoom meeting August 1, 2023

- Establish (Re)Engage Alabama Grant Program
 - Encourage adults with college credit to return;
 - Increase the number of AL adults with a college degree;
 - Provide grant award payments to eligible adults;
 - Provide eligibility standards;
 - Provide ACHE resource for administration (5%)

\$4.5 million

- Establish the Alabama Short-term Credential Program
 - Help Alabamians earn short-term credentials;
 - Determine eligible standards;
 - Establish procedures for administration (ACCS);
 - Set forth the process for funding;
 - Repeal the Alabama Apprenticeship Tax Credit Act.

Establish a Short-Term Credential Scholarship Fund


Eligible Student per Act 2023-539

- Is an Alabama Resident
 - Proof includes a current valid Alabama driver license (front and back), a current valid Alabama vehicle registration, or a current valid Alabama voter registration card
- Is 25 years of age or older at time of current enrollment
- Has been out of college for two years prior to current enrollment
- Has a **completed** FAFSA
 - FAFSA must be completed, but individuals do not have to qualify for Pell grant and do not have to take out a Federal loan to receive (Re)Engage. Individuals should accept a Pell Grant if they qualify.
- Is pursuing their **first** associate <u>or</u> baccalaureate **degree**.
 - Only can pursue their first degree but having earned a certificate is acceptable



Eligible Student per Act 2023-539

- Has earned 36 credits toward an associate degree or 72 hours toward a baccalaureate degree of the approved program
- Has been accepted, admitted, or enrolled in an approved program
- Is enrolled in six hours or more per semester
- Is in good academic standing by college and/or program
- Is enrolled in courses of study directly leading to a degree identified in alignment with a job on the ACCCP list of high demand programs



Award Amounts per Act 2023-539

- Full-time Students (at least 12 hours; maximum amount)
 - \$1,500 per semester for students pursuing an associate
 - \$3,000 per semester for students pursuing a bachelor's
- Part-time Students
 - **Prorated for 6-11 hours** (\$125 per credit hour for associate; \$250 per credit hour for bachelor's)
 - Prorated for quarter terms: 3 semester credit hours is equivalent to 4.5 quarter credit hours
- A student grant recipient who elects to transfer from the original awarding institution to another educational institution will automatically become ineligible for the grant as this program award is not transferable from one educational institution to another.

Step 4. Determine How to Distribute Funding

A plan for <u>52 approved institutions</u> and <u>41 offered CIPs</u> was used to determine the distribution of funds.

- The allocation is based on the proportional share of Alabama-resident graduates in the approved programs divided by available funds.
- The following data sources were used for projection calculation:
 - Using ACHE data files and IPEDS reports via NCES, determined the average of in-state graduates for ACHE and ACCS colleges and universities in qualifying majors since 2015 by degree level and approved majors.
 - Similar calculation for private, nonprofit institutions using IPEDS and institutional data requests
- Develop funding per institution for which the calculation yields ample funding for student(s) to complete a degree in one of the qualifying programs aligning with ACCCP Occupation List

Results

• Funding distributed in a 26% ± to 74% ± split between associate and baccalaureate degrees based on the average count of in-state graduates since 2015. Baccalaureate students will receive a higher award because of greater enrollment cost as prescribed in the bill.

Approval Process for the Administrative Procedures of the New Chapter 300-4-13: (Re)Engage Alabama Grant Program

- The Proposed Administrative Procedures were preliminarily approved by the Commission during September Commission meeting and filed with the Legislative Services Agency (LSA) on September 20.
- It was published on September 29 in the *Alabama Administrative Monthly* (AAM), allowing 45 days for interested parties to comment. No comments received thus far.
- At the December Commission meeting, the Proposed Administrative Procedures will be presented to the Commission for final approval to be deemed as Certified Administrative Procedures.

(Re)Engage Alabama Grant Program

General Information

The purpose of the (Re)Engage Alabama Grant Program is to increase the number of Alabama adults with college degrees; to encourage adults who have earned some college credit hours to return to college, enroll, and complete a college degree program that is connected with workforce development needs and aligned with Alabama's high demand occupations list; and to provide financial assistance to adult learners of the State of Alabama for postsecondary education in the State of Alabama.

Student Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible for an (Re)Engage Alabama Grant Program award, the student must be:

- An Alabama Resident (proof includes a current valid Alabama driver license (front and back), a current valid Alabama vehicle registration, or a current valid Alabama voter registration card)
- · 25 years of age or older at time of current enrollment
- · Has been out of college for two years prior to current enrollment
- Has a completed FAFSA
- Pursuing the first associate or baccalaureate degree
- Has earned 36 credits toward an associate degree or 72 hours toward a baccalaureate degree of the approved program
- · Has been accepted, admitted, or enrolled in an approved program
- Is enrolled in six hours or more per semester
- Is in good academic standing by college and/or program
- Is enrolled in courses of study directly leading to a degree identified in alignment with a job on the ACCCP list of high demand programs as determined by the funding process developed by Alabama Commission on Higher Education
- Assistance will cover no more than a total of 120 academic hours for baccalaureate degree and 60 hours for associate degree

Use of Social Security Number

Section 7(b) of the Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. 522a) requires that when any Federal, State, or local government agency requests an individual to disclose his/her social security account number, that individual must also be advised whether that disclosure is mandatory or voluntary, by what statutory or other authority the number is solicited, and what uses will be made of it.

Accordingly, applicants are advised that disclosure of their social security account number (SSAN) is required as a condition for participation in the (Re)Engage Alabama Grant Program, in view of the practical administrative difficulties which the Program would encounter in maintaining adequate program records without the continued use of the SSAN.

The SSAN will be used to verify the identity of the applicant and as an account number (identifier) throughout the life of the grant in order to record necessary data accurately. As an identifier, the SSAN is used in such Program activities as: determining program eligibility, certifying school attendance, making and verifying grant payments, and maintaining records of grant payments.


Authority for requiring the disclosure of an applicant's SSAN is in section 7(a)2 of the Privacy Act, which provides that an agency may require disclosure of an individual's SSAN as a condition for the granting of a right, benefit, or privilege provided by law.






